

Reporting Abuse and Neglect of Older Adults with Disabilities: What Health Care Teams Need to Know

In Ohio, medical professionals are mandated to report suspected elder abuse, neglect, or exploitation (Section 5101.63 of Ohio Revised Code).

Ways to Report Suspected Abuse, Neglect, or Exploitation

- If the person is in immediate danger, call local law enforcement.
- If the person is 60 years or over and living in the community,
 - » Adult Protective Services (APS): 1-855-OHIO-APS

 - » Your county's department of Job and Family Services jfs.ohio.gov/County/cntydir.stm
- If the person has a developmental disability,
 - » Developmental Disabilities Abuse/Neglect Hotline: 1-866-313-6733 (M-F 8 a.m.-4:30 p.m.)
- If the person lives in a health care facility and suspected abuse is by another resident or staff member,
 - » Ohio Department of Health Hotline: 1-800-342-0553
- If the person lives in a mental health facility,
 - » For facilities with 3 to 16 residents call APS: 1-855-OHIO-APS
 - » For all other mental health facilities call The Ohio Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services: 1-877-275-6364

Additional Information on Reporting Suspected Abuse and Neglect

- Reports of suspected abuse or neglect can be made anonymously.
- You do not need to have evidence of abuse or neglect to provide a report. There
 are no consequences for making a report that is not validated later but there are
 consequences for failing to make a report as a mandated reporter.

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
